Your donations included the following items: 25 baby blankets, 67 bibs, 2 bath sets (towels and wash cloths), 1 crib sheet, 27 sleepers, 1 Sippee cup, 3 packs of diapers, 21 pairs of socks, a hat plus the love and best wishes from our congregation to the new parents who will be given one of these packages.

With the retirement of **Dr. Janet Guyer**, the PCUSA Missionary we have supported for many years, the Mission Committee selected **Rev. Cheryl Barnes** as the new PCUSA Missionary to support. Rev. Happy New Year from the Portville Community Food Pantry! As we head into the New Year, I would like to give a brief update on the events as 2022 concludes.

First off, many know our wonderful friend, Stephanie, has retired from her longtime post as Community Food Pantry Coordinator. One of her last actions was finding a replacement. She was successful in finding this person. After some creative discussion, I said ok, let's do it !!!! Wish me luck. God Bless and thank-you Stephanie for all the years you gave to the food pantry.

The past couple months saw an increase of people using the Food Pantry. We had 4 or 5 new families apply for the first time as well a few individuals. The food pantry is providing support for approximately an additional 40 people of our community.

The students from the Portville Central School National Honor Society held their yearly food drive and collected 2500 food items. They not only unloaded the school bus but also helped sort the donated food into categories. This equates to about 1500 pounds of much needed food to support our mission.
