The new **Class of 2026 Elders-Kari** and **Steve** -were ordained June 25 during worship. Ordination of elders is a special occasion in the life of the church with the laying on of hands of all elders present. There was a coffee hour reception after worship to honor Kari and Steve. Their first official duty to serve as elders was to serve the cake! Thank you for answering the call Kari and Steve to serve our congregation as elders!

The Session approved purchasing an AED unit for the church with funds from the Building Improvement and Preservation Fund. There will be an in-person AED/CPR training class at the church in the near future for interested members of the congregation. More information will be available soon with a sign up list for the class.

The **Post Pentecost Picnic** held at War Veterans Park in Olean on June 3 was a wonderful success! There was a total of 60 people who attended from the Olean Presbyterian Church and the Portville Presbyterian Church. There was a lot of delicious food and fabu-

lous fellowship visiting with each other. And what a fun game-Who Am I?-a name label with the name of a famous person was put on each person's back. Then throughout the picnic that person had to ask others questions to figure out whose name was on the label on their back. This created a lot of good conversations and laughs.

The Carillon that was donated by the Atkinson Family in memory of their daughter, Debra Atkinson, was updated by The Sound Track in Allegany with funds from the Memorial Fund. The carillon is once again playing beautifully for the church and community to en-joy. Thank you, Tim , for coordinating this project.

Mission News - Cso Woodworth

The Mission Committee is looking for recommendations, from you, for organizations that provide services/assistance to youth in our area to donate our 40% from the Pentecost offering. If you are aware of a local organization, that we do not already support, please contact the church and let us know. The committee will decide in August where to send this year's Pentecost Offering.

We also voted to discontinue the collection, cleaning, and sending of medicine bottles. Please read Tim Alexander's article on the ending of this Mission Project.

The committee voted to financially support Remote Area Medical (coming Sept. 9–11, 2023 to the Olean YMCA) with a \$1500 donation from our Mission Trip Fund. When RAM was here two years ago, the clinic saw the most patients came their Dental Clinic. Unfortunately they were not able to provide dental services to all who were in need. This year, RAM has recruited dentists from outside our immediate area to assist with the need to dental services. Our donation will to help cover the expense of hotel rooms for the volun-teer out-of-town dentists during their two day dental service marathon.

We also agreed to support a new local **ongoing hands-on Mission Project.** In March the African American Cultural Development Center, in Olean NY, had on loan from the New York State Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation Department the exhibit titled: Journey to the North: New York's Freedom Trail Banners. Members of Rev. Hale's Bible study (and a few tag-alongs who learned through the grapevine) visited this exhibit. Mar

Through that visit we (yes, I was one of the "tag-alongs") learned about the Center and the work that needs to be completed to be fully open to the public.

The African American Cultural Development Center has a long list of work that needs to be completed. Working with Della Moore, a room-by-room list of work that needed to be completed on the first floor was developed. Session approved our church's participation in this ongoing Mission Project. We will be scheduling work days at the Center soon. Each work session will have jobs of varying skill levels. This will include anything from cleaning and wiping down cabinets to repairing small holes in the flooring where pipes came up through to sanding woodwork to laying down laminate floors. Each scheduled work day will have a items from the list which was created with Della that will be tackled. As with any house repairs there are some items that need to be completed before other work can be done. Stay tuned for when this hands-on Mission work will begin. This is similar the "Christmas in April (in July)" projects many of you may have participated in the 1990's – 2006, except this will not be just a one day event but rather an ongoing one so that the Center's director, Della, can offer the programs and informational displays she has so thoughtfully developed.

Medicine Bottle Collection Ends - Tim

It was Geoffery Chaucer, the 14th century English writer, who was credited with the saying "All good things must come to an end". After years of cleaning, packaging, and sending used medicine bottles to the Matthew 25 Ministries located in Cincinnati, Ohio, our participation in the program has come to an end. We thank those who have dedicated the time and effort to process and send thousands of medicine bottles for reuse to our disadvantaged brethren internationally.

Several factors contributed to the decision to move on from the medicine bottle reuse effort. Chief among the decision was the inability to efficiently and effectively meet requirements to ensure a *certified clean and uncontaminated container* was issued for reuse. Approximately 25% of all bottles turned in were routinely rejected for reuse based on appearance alone. And shipping costs have steadily increased over time. Transportation costs alone are enough to challenge the cost effectiveness of reuse.

Not all is lost. Although we won't be reusing the bottles, there is hope they can be recycled and turned into other usable products. This will require a little effort by all of us to see that the bottles are placed into the recycling "waste stream".

Again, thank you to those who participated in the medicine bottle reuse effort in the past. We will continue to seek out missions that support the disadvantaged and promote a sustainable planet.


Everyone's work makes our church look inviting and well loved.

- Vision: eye exams with glasses made on site, testing for glaucoma, diabetic retinopathy
- Medical: General medicine. (i.e. Prevention: Breasts exams, diabetes screening, physicals, women's health, and more.)

All patients will have the option of receiving DENTAL and MEDICAL OR VISION and MEDICAL care on the same day.

Time will not permit receiving **DENTAL** and **VISION** on the same day.

NO APPOINTMENTS NEEDED

- Services are offered on a FIRST COME FIRST SERVE basis.
- NO Proof of Residency or Income required!
- BRING all medications with you and TAKE all medications as you normally do.
- Bring your own food and drinks.

Please consider volunteering to assist with this event. I (Cso) have volunteered for two of these clinics. My first experience was greeting people as they entered and providing clinic options and directions to them. My second experience was working in the Optical area. This area had several "jobs" to choose from. . .help with frames selection for patients, keeping the tables restocked with frames, data entry, and being a runner where you take the frames and the lens script to their on-site lab where the script is filled and lenses put into the frames and completed glasses are picked up.

Volunteers can begin arriving at 5 a.m. There will be coffee, water and lunch available to all volunteers.
