Message from Rev. Hale

"even the sparrow finds a home,"even a Portville robin or starling....

You've heard me *crow* about this verse before, even listened as I have interrupted the "flow" of a worship service to note the bird song drifting down from the outside eaves and into the sanctuary on a Sunday morning!

The verse is found in Psalm 84, at least the first line is found there, and the rest just comes rolling off my tongue as the noise of hungry baby birds, desperate for the breakfast tidbit in their parent's beak, catches my ear *and* my attention! It's a distraction that I'm ready to share with any who are nearby!

If you look up this Psalm in our pew Bibles, you'll find it is graced with the title: "The Joy of Worship in the Temple." That's what this Psalm is about, the written-downsong that lay in the heart of someone who would worship at Solomon's beautiful Temple in ancient Jerusalem; someone who felt close to God in that sacred "space."

"How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts!
My soul longs, indeed it faints for the courts of the Lord;
my heart and my flesh sing for joy to the living God."

..... and then he spotted a bird, secure and at peace, nested in the stone carvings on the Temple building, high above the massive doors. At home, with a reed and ink and papyrus at hand, and the Spirit alive in his heart and mind, he wrote down not only what he had seen, but what he *felt*.

"Even the sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest...."

Many find their "home" in the sacred space we share together. Our beautiful church and sanctuary is the *place* that allows us to physically come together. But I believe we find the "home" the writer of this Psalm describes, in the *worship* we share together each week. Worship is our "home" where we feel secure and at peace, when we are able to be together on a Sunday morning, or when we tune in to the service on our laptops from far away.

Food Pantry News—Stephanie

From month to month, there is a rhythm to how we operate the food pantry. It can be fun and satisfying but it can also be overwhelming and time consuming. We are trying a "new thing" and the response has been wonderful! From set-up to deliveries, and the phone orders and shopping in-between, many of you have stepped up to take on one of the many tasks that make up our food pantry operation. This is on-going, 12 months a year – but many hands do help lighten the load.

The food pantry is open the fourth Wednesday each month, 9 a.m. to noon. Set-up is Monday morning and takes about an hour. Phone orders can be done from your own home or at the church and also takes about an hour. Shoppers are given one or two specific items to purchase at Aldi's, money is provided, and you have flexibility over a two week period to make the purchase and return to food pantry. Deliveries are made during food pantry hours on the fourth Wednesday.
