The **ANNUAL RUMMAGE SALE** in January netted a total sales amount of \$989. As always, a big thank you goes out to Barb Fairbanks and the many volunteers who help to set up and run this annual mission project!

Hannah Kloss again delivered an inspiring Minute for Mission cheer for our annual **SOUPER BOWL OF CARING** drive. Her efforts helped to bring in one hundred and ten cans of soup and a whopping \$442 in cash donations to benefit the Portville Community Food Pantry.

This year marked the 12th year for the annual **FUN FLEECE FESTIVAL**. A big thanks to all 19 participants who came out to help make 25 fleece blankets to be donated to the Southern Tier Child Advocacy Center. A special thanks to our participants from Jonah's Attic; and to Vicki Schmidt for coordinating this ecumenical hands-on Mission Project!

CAMPERSHIPS are again available for this upcoming summer season and the church will pay the full-cost of any Christian-based camp children of our congregation would like to attend. Camp Duffield in Delevan, NY has week-long summer camps for children from 1st – 12th grades. It's a wonderful experience! Jesus' ministry was among those who were most vulnerable. He preached good news to the poor and release to the captives. The Mission Committee has set a goal of \$800 for the congregation's gifts to OGHS. Special offering envelopes are available in the pew racks on March 10, 17 and 24; the offering envelopes will be in your bulletins on March 31, the Sunday our gifts will be dedicated to One Great Hour of Sharing. If we all do a little, it adds up to a lot!

Sunday School classes met on February 3 and 10 and will meet on March 3 and 10.

The **Nursery Class** continues to have great attendance – all 7 were at Sunday School in February. We read the story of Joseph and his “special coat” and learned that jealousy made Joseph’s brothers do some unkind things to him. In the end, Joseph forgave his family. We also learned about Moses and how his sister protected him – just like the kiddos in our class protect and keep their younger siblings safe!

The **Elementary Class** is learning about things that happened in Jesus' life. We read the story about "the last will be first and the first will be last." "The Widow's Mite" was a story we read about the old woman giving only two coins which was all she had. In richness she gave the most. The class learned about different money amounts and coin values from actual coins, silver dollars, and paper money. Each was given \$1 to put into the Offering – because that was all they had! Looking forward to Easter, we are discussing a fun project for all the congregation to see!

The topic of discussion at the **Acts 29** gathering in February was how the things we do, whether positive or negative, can have an effect on those around us. Ideas were offered on how to be the "positive" in someone else's life, even if they are strangers. Take note of the saying on the wall in the lounge area adjoining the dining room; it reflects the conversations and ideas shared at their meeting.

The **Lenten Soup and Study** will be held on Sundays following worship on March 17, 24, 31 and April 7. All are welcome to join us for a light lunch and fellowship.
