Maybe you have noticed the moon these last two weeks, growing steadily into itself from that beautiful, thin sliver of a crescent. Even half full, it filled the dark sky with light on a clear night; a tiny luminescent misshapen marble grown now to three quarter, *ruling the night* as it arcs its way across the *dome*, etching the outline of the trees in the woods, beeches long bare now, hemlock boughs momentarily catching scatterings of dried oak leaves.

Julie Xxxxxx continues to lead the **American Sign Language** class. Attendance for this class is high . ..


