Message from Rev. Hale

Then Jesus took the bread, and after giving thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples saying, this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me. [Luke 22:19]

Portville Community Food Pantry—Randy

The food pantry is busier than ever! Going into November there are 121 individuals on the food pantry client list. This is an increase of 17 people since January. There is so much need. The amounts of many food items purchased are going to have to be increased to keep up with the demand.

Randy McClain, Coordinator of the PCFP, presented a message about the Portville Community Food Pantry for the Faith on the Fifth (Sunday) worship service October 29. Be sure to check the First Presbyterian Church of Portville NY Facebook Group for the entire message and service. The equivalent of 8,000 meals have been provided to food pantry clients January–September 2023! What would these families do if there wasn't a food pantry?!?!?! There is much need for assistance with food insecurities that some members of our community are facing! And there are so many that respond to answer that need from our community! Blessings abound! It is an ongoing need/response each and every month. It does not end, it increases–especially during the winter months with higher heating costs. Have you made food or monetary donations to the food pantry already?

Mission Committee - Cso

During the Remote Area Medical Clinic, held on September 9 & 10 in Olean, NY, I volunteered at the Optics Clinic. Patients visiting Optical were provided with free eye exams, free frames (of their choice) and lenses. If bifocals were needed, they had the choice of receiving two free pairs of glasses (near and far vision) or they could get bifocals with the understanding that their frame and prescription would be sent to RAM's lab in Tennessee and the glasses would be mailed to them.



During the clinic that was held, 342 patients were registered with \$143,745 in medical services provided.

Peace and Global Witness Offering: WOW! This congregation took the Peace and Global Witness Coloring Sheet Challenge to heart. The challenge was . . . "For Each colored coloring sheet returned an additional \$5 would be donated to our Peace and Global Witness Offering." In the end, 51 (Yes . . . you read that right!) were returned during our Peace and Global Witness Offering Campaign. . . Even some of our Sunday School children participated. All of the returned coloring sheets are posted on our Peacemaking Tree in the hallway before the dining room. It is such an uplifting and amazing sight to see whenever you walk by it. . . Thanking God for your participation. And that's not where your giving ended for the Peace and Global Witness Offering. Our goal was set at \$950. . . The final total donated was \$1360. The recipient of our 25% (\$340) was the African American Center for Cultural Development. To provide continued support for the Center an additional \$160 was added from the Mission Challenge Fund to bring our donation for the Center to \$500. The Mission Committee is ever grateful for you and your giving hearts.

Presents For Panthers: We will again be participating in Portville Central School's annual "Presents For Panthers" gift collection for students attending the school. Thank you to Kathy Hendrix for taking the lead in this Mission Project. Announcements about the types of toys/gifts to purchase will be coming before the traditional Black Friday Sales begin.

The following donations we approved by the Mission Committee:

Hunger Fund: Olean Salvation Army – \$400; Pfeiffer Nature Center – \$450 (as a sponsor of their Christmas Wreath Sale);

Jack Shepherd Memorial Mission Fund: Wycliffe Bible Translators supporting Steve and Marjorie Doty – \$750; and supporting Leah Doty – \$750; PC USA Mission Support sponsoring Rev. Cheryl Barnes in her mission work in Malawi – \$500; Presbyterian Disaster Assistance providing assistance with the Hawaii Wildfires – \$1000 and earthquake relief in Turkey and Syria – \$1000.

The rehab work at the African American Center for Cultural Development continues. Touch up painting has been completed. Julie and John Pagett have installed the vinyl laminate flooring in the kitchen as well as replaced some huge masonry blocks that supported the kitchen sink with some much smaller risers.
